WHAT ARE CASCADING EFFECTS OF THE EDUCATION CRISIS



Class 1-8: Poor foundational learning

7.1% students in grade 3 cannot read letters and 37.5% in grade 8 cannot do division



Class 9: High learning gap & pressure

Dropout rate at secondary level in Govt schools in 2017-18 was 24.03%




Unemployment rate of youth between the ages 15-24

was 30.3% in 2017-18 (more than national average)



Drug Addiction

Punjab was II in injected drug use (2019) and 60% youth (18-25) preferred songs glorifying drugs and violence



Migration & Brain Drain

In just two years, Punjab saw a 66% growth in the number of visa applicants (2019)



Economic Downfall

Punjab's per capita income falls to Rs1.15L, lower than national average (2021)



SCHOOL LEVEL


We bridge the gap between the school and community by engaging the Panchayat, SMC and community




